### PE and Sports Grant

#### Purpose of Funding

All schools in England have been allocated funding to enable them to improve the provision of PE and Sport. At West Felton CE Primary, we want to be able to provide the following:

- increase the provision and the range of opportunities available for high quality PE and Sport; within the curriculum and out of school hours, to be sustained.
- ensure that the provision is challenging and appropriate and that support mechanisms are in place to allow all children to reach their full potential.
- improve the levels of progress in PE for all children.
- create effective networks and partnerships with other schools and our feeder Secondary School.
- to upskill staff using high quality sports coaches.
- ensure that provision is fully inclusive, engaging, innovative, inspiring and specifically tailored to meet future aspirations.

#### Possible uses of the funding could include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers and qualified sports coaches to work with all staff responsible for teaching PE
- contributing, along with cluster primary schools, to pay for the head of PE at the Secondary feeder school, to coordinate tournaments, etc.
- providing cover to release teachers to attend courses and PE network meetings.
- hiring the Village Hall to accommodate a class of children for gymnastics and dance.
- hiring transport to enable children to attend tournaments, etc.

The school does not let its isolated position become a barrier to attending sporting competitions and works collaboratively with other schools in order to reduce transport costs. The school has been able to attend a wide range of competitions this year. This has given our children the opportunity to participate in events, develop, positive behaviour: commitment, self esteem and a sense of fair play. Promotion of positive values through active physical activity.

Residential provided opportunity for children to experience new sports and outdoor activity eg. gorge walking, kayaking, rock climbing. Children faced appropriate levels of challenge and experienced success, raising their self confidence, self esteem and self reliance. These shared experiences with others in the outdoors help lead to a greater understanding of themselves, other people and the environment.
