This is a great time for you to keep encouraging and motivating your child to read more often. Please encourage your child to read a range of different genres- mystery, adventure, fantasy, historical stories, comics, information books or explore an author. Continue to share books with your child—take turns, read extracts, discuss the story and characters, it really is one of the most helpful things you can do. Reading impacts hugely on children's writing ability and general learning.

Sometimes it can seem tricky to choose a book that you enjoy reading, if this is a problem for your child you could use the BookTrust Book Finder website (www.booktrust.org.uk/books/bookfinder) or talk to us at school.
