**Literacy:**

Our Literacy this term will be linked with our topic where possible particularly our class reader Robin Hood.

This will include:

- Adventure stories
- Persuasive/ argument writing
- Dialogue/ playscript
- Newspaper reports
- Narrative poetry- The Highwayman
- Non-chronological writing

**Numeracy:**

We will continue to develop efficient methods of calculating for all four operations to solve problems within a variety of contexts including measures. We will be using fractions and decimals in particular this term, linking our work to other areas of the curriculum where appropriate.

**Science:**

**Forces and magnets**

We will observe how magnets attract or repel each other. We will group objects on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet and identify magnetic materials.  
We will explore gravity, friction, levers and cogs.

**ICT:**

This will continue to be cross-curricular based. We will be using Scratch in our coding work and Revelation art to create art as well as continuing research using the internet and discussing e-safety.

**French:**

We will develop our French vocabulary through games, songs and stories, including words and phrases relating to journey to school and the seasons.

**ART:**

We will focus on winter trees and landscape painting, looking at works by Gainsborough and Monet.

We will be looking at making shelters and surviving outdoors as an outlaw.
