Spring Term 1 - Hot and Cold

<u>Literacy - Fiction</u>:. Pig in the pond, Hello World, Diary of a Wombat, Josephine wants to dance. Postcard writing, Diary writing, description. Nouns, verbs and adjectives, types of sentences and suffixes/prefixes.

Non-Fiction: Information texts about Hot and Cold Countries, Australia and animals. Labelling a diagram and finding information.

Poetry: Humorous Poems/ A study of Spike Milligan.

Maths - Number and place value, addition and subtraction, measuring mass

<u>Science</u> — Hot and cold habitats, what animals/ plants are found in different climates, their features & adaptations. The basic needs of animals and plants. How animals initially look after their young. Co-dependency of animals and plants in an environment.

<u>Geography</u> – Identify the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles. Identifying continents and seas. Weather symbols and the forecast.

<u>History</u> – Finding out about events beyond living memory that are significant nationally and globally – Scott of the Antarctic.

<u>ICT</u> - Internet safety. 'Off we go' make decisions about bear's journey. 'Postcard maker' 'Weather words' - use words to describe a scene. 'Dress Humpty' for different weathers. Find out how the weather forecast service uses ICT.

<u>PE</u> - Gymnastics with Border Counties. PE - Hit, Catch, Run. Wake Up Shake Up.

<u>Art and DT - Design</u> and make a shoe box hot or cold habitat scene, using a variety of materials and techniques.

Polar animal art and craft and patterns on animals from hot climates - camouflage through art.

<u>PSHE - Health and Wellbeing: Growing and Changing, Keeping Safe.</u>

<u>Music</u> — Weather songs, using instruments to represent a sound, composing, chanting and singing.

RE - Why are some stories special?

Role Play - Travel agents/ Clothes for climates.

Worship - Truthfulness
